FAQs

Frequently Asked Questions and Answers

Q: What is “Parent University?”

A: Parent University is simply a structure to provide parents with opportunities to become involved in their child’s education and within the life of their school.

Q: Why should I participate? What’s in it for me and/or my child?

A: Research by the US Department of Education has indicated that parent involvement is the most influential factor in determining a student’s success in schools. Recognizing that the field of education has evolved markedly over the decades since we were in school, Parent University endeavors to equip parents with the tools they need to support their children’s learning. For example, the Math, ELA and Behavior workshops that we offer are designed to help parents understand our curriculum (what students are being taught) and pedagogy (how they are being taught). Your exposure to this knowledge will help you to better support your child’s learning at home, thus increasing their opportunities for success.

Q: How much time is involved?

A: If you were to participate in the 10 core events, your annual commitment would total less than 10 hours. Since your child will spend more than 1,000 hours in school this year, we feel that asking parents to dedicate less than 1% of this time is a reasonable expectation.

Q: Is this really “required?”

A: As a school principal there are limits to my jurisdiction. So, no, I cannot officially “require” parents to attend our Core Events. My goal, however, is to inspire you to value this work and motivate you to become involved.
