By participating in the Food Production, Nutrition, and Health Teacher Training, the school and teacher agrees to fully implement Course 1, 2, or 3 during the 2016-2017 school year. Full course implementation includes:

- Complete the week-long teacher training prior to the implementation of the course. This training will provide background information about project-based learning, methods of assessing student mastery of the technical and academic learning, managing and teaching in a project-based learning classroom, and using effectively technology for the specific projects making up the courses.
- Offering Course 1, 2, or 3 as a one semester-long course beginning with the 2016-2017 school year.
- Teach the complete project-units (as written) from Course 1, 2, or 3 during the 2016-2017 school year.
- Administering the formative and summative assessments outlined in the course syllabus, including the end-of-course assessment.
- Committing to fidelity of course implementation.
- Providing the resources needed to offer the course.
- Collaborate with university faculty in regards to professional development initiatives
- Working collaboratively with the State Department of Education and maintaining frequent contact with the state project director.
- Participating in regular feedback sessions (via teleconference or webinar)
- Administering student surveys regarding students' beliefs, knowledge, and behaviors in relationship to Food and Nutrition Science and the project-units that are taught. The surveys will be administered at multiple points during the 2016-2017 school year

Finally, teachers should also:

- Be an exemplary teacher in the career area.
- Be inspirational, talented, and enthusiastic and committed to the success of the curriculum
- Possess good communication, team management, leadership, problem-solving and interpersonal skills.





Teachers that participate in the Food Production, Nutrition, and Health Teacher Training will be provided a stipend of \$500 to \$1,000. In addition, teachers will receive a supply kit worth up to \$500. The supplies will be those required to teach the projects associated with the course. In addition, round-trip mileage, lodging, and meals will also be provided. Transportation will be provided by UNL from Lincoln to Manhattan, and then back to Lincoln.

Graduate credit can be earned through the University of Nebraska-Lincoln for this course; arrangements to pay the tuition will need to be made by the individual seeking the credit.
