MINUTES OF THE WORK SESSION – Thursday, April 12, 2012

The State Board of Education met for purposes of a work session on Thursday, April 12, 2012, beginning at 2:00 p.m. The work session was held at the State Office Building in the State Board Meeting Room in Lincoln, Nebraska. Publicized notice of the work session was given by posting notice on the Department’s website on the internet; emailed to news media requesting notification and posting a copy of the agenda in the Office of the Commissioner of Education, which gave the date, time and location of the meeting.

1. CALL TO ORDER

- 1.1 President Scheer called the meeting to order at 2:03 p.m. Roll call showed the following members present: Lynn Cronk, Jim Scheer, Mark Quandahl, Rebecca Valdez, John Sieler, Patricia Timm, Molly O’Holleran, and Robert Evnen. Commissioner Breed was also present.

- 7.05 Motion by Mark Quandahl, second by Robert Evnen: That this board grant the Commissioner authority to approve a hearing draft of Rule 10 (92 NAC 10), *Regulations and Procedures for the Accreditation of Schools*, to appoint a hearing officer, and set a date, time and place for a hearing for the addition of requirements relating to the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance. The proposed change is as follows:

003.12 Each public school district shall require each such district's schools to establish a period of time during the school day, when a majority of pupils is scheduled to be present, during which pupils will be led in the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance in the presence of the flag of the United States of America, in grades kindergarten through twelve. Pupil participation in the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance shall be voluntary. Pupils not participating in the recitation of the Pledge shall be permitted to silently stand or remain seated but shall be required to respect the rights of those pupils electing to participate.

Jessica L. Wheeler*. Publicized notice of the hearing was given by posting notice on the Department's website on the internet; e-mailed to news media requesting notification and posting a copy of the agenda in the Office of the Commissioner of Education, which gave the date, time and location of the hearing. Specific notice of the hearing was provided to the parties involved in the proceeding.

CHAPTER 91

**REPLACEMENT ERRATA SHEET FOR RULE 91
WITH PROPOSED LB1039 LANGUAGE**

only the flashing stop hazard warning signal flasher lights when receiving or discharging pupils if a school bus loading area warning sign is displayed. Such signs shall not be directly attached to any school bus but shall be free standing and placed at the rear of a parked school bus or line of parked school buses. No school district shall utilize a school bus loading area warning sign unless such sign complies with the requirements of Section 60-6,176 R.R.S.: (AM 1796 LB 1039)

005.03A1 Under Section 60-6,176 R.R.S., the Department of Roads, by rule and regulation, is to adopt and promulgate uniform standards for school bus loading area warning signs. Such standards shall include requirements for the size, material, construction, and required wording. No school district shall use a school bus loading area warning sign unless such sign complies with all rules and regulations adopted and promulgated by the Department of Roads. The cost of any sign shall be an obligation of the school district.

005.03B Additionally-The following procedure shall be observed when controlling traffic with a school bus during the process of loading and unloading:

005.03A B1 Use rearview mirror system to check all traffic.

005.03B2 Reduce the school bus speed with minimal brake usage and without greatly interrupting the flow of traffic.

005.03C Activate the ~~amber~~ school bus ~~alternately~~ flashing yellow warning signal lights. (AM 1796 LB 1039)

005.03C1 Not less than 500 feet or more than 1,000 feet from the bus stop in any area outside the corporate limits of any city or village.

005.03C2 At least 300 feet and not more than 600 feet from the bus stop within the corporate limits of any city or village.

005.03D During the stopping process, allow sufficient area to the right of the bus so that children and other passengers may clear the bus safely.

005.03E After the school bus has stopped, place the transmission in "Park". If there is no "Park" shift point, place the transmission in "Neutral" and set the parking brake at each stop.

005.03F Check to see if traffic is able to stop, activate the alternating flashing red warning lamps, and extend stop arm.

005.03G Check to see if road is clear in both directions or that all traffic is stopped. When the road is clear and all traffic has stopped, open door to load and unload children and other passengers.
