SUBJECT: Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) Parts B and C Applications

In order to qualify for grant awards under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Nebraska must annually submit applications under Parts B and C of the Act. The applications include: 1) a Statement of Assurances which assures that Nebraska has in effect policies and procedures which meet all of the eligibility requirements of Parts B and C; 2) a description of the steps NDE will take to ensure equitable access to, and participation in, activities conducted under IDEA; 3) a description of the use of funds made available under the IDEA; 4) documentation of public participation in the development and review of the plans; and 5) a list of all rules, regulations and policies that are state-imposed and not required by IDEA or the federal regulations.

The applications must be available for review for at least 60 days and the public must have opportunity to comment on the plans for a period of at least 30 days. Nebraska's IDEA Part B and Part C FY 2011 applications were available for review from February 22, 2011 through April 25, 2011. Public comments were accepted from February 22, 2011 through March 28, 2011. No comments were received. The applications must be submitted to the Federal Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) by May 10, 2011. Approval of the applications will provide Nebraska with the following federal dollars:
