Prior to joining NDE in 2004 she served as a teacher in various school districts in Nebraska and was a teacher and administrator on the Rosebud Reservation in South Dakota for seven years.

In her current position, Carol frequently provides professional development to school districts, teacher education classes, and educational organizations on working with Native American students, understanding culture, integrating Native American culture into the curriculum and developing cultural competence. She also believes in giving back to the community. Carol has served on the board of directors for the Indian Center of Lincoln and is currently serving on the board of directors for Family Services of Lincoln, Humanities Nebraska, Humanities Nebraska Foundation and is a TEAMMATES mentor with Lincoln Public Schools.
