**Perkins Intent to Participate – Due Date: February 22**

This notification is to request action to complete the intent to participate process for Perkins funding during the 2016-2017 program year. All school districts, even if participating in a consortium, career academy, or choosing not to participate, must complete the data collection. The form must be submitted by the District Administrator.

This action is accomplished through the official submission of the intent and eligibility to participate in Perkins through the NDE Portal located at <https://portal.education.ne.gov/> under the "Data Collections" tab. This specific data collection is entitled "Perkins IV Career and Technical Education."

The online system asks district officials to:

- 1) Determine Intent to Participate in Perkins with consortium identification if applicable;
- 2) Validate the existence of all Essential Career Education Components within the School District; and
- 3) Identify the Career Student Organizations offered within the School District

The deadline for completing the online submission is February 22.

**New NSSRS Validation Errors**

Five new Validation Errors have been added to the NSSRS Validation website available through the NDE Portal under the Student & Staff (NSSRS) tab.

**-565 Dual Credit Course Reported For Student Below 9th Grade:** A record was reported in the Student Grades template with a Dual Credit Code that indicates the student was dual enrolled in a course (reporting either a 1 "Yes" or 2 "No") while the student's current grade level was lower than 9<sup>th</sup> grade.

**-566 No Superintendent Reported at District:** All Rule 10 accredited and Rule 14 approved public and nonpublic districts must report one person with at least a portion of their position assignment FTE coded as a Superintendent (0-2320) in NSSRS Staff Reporting. If an approved nonpublic district does not have its own superintendent, the superintendent responsible for visitations should be listed.

**-567 No Principal/Head Teacher Reported at a School:** All Rule 10 accredited public and nonpublic schools must report one person with at least a portion of their position assignment FTE coded as a Principal (2410) in NSSRS Staff Reporting. Rule 14 approved nonpublic schools may report a Head Teacher (1150) instead.

**-568 No Counselor Reported at a Middle/Secondary School:** All Rule 10 accredited public and nonpublic middle/secondary/high schools must report one person with at least a portion of their position assignment FTE coded as a Counselor (2120 or 2121) in NSSRS Staff Reporting.

**-569 No Librarian/Media Specialist Reported Within a District:** All Rule 10 accredited public and nonpublic districts must report one person with at least a portion of their position assignment FTE coded as a Librarian (2222) or Media Specialist (2223) in NSSRS Staff Reporting. The Librarian/Media Specialist may be reported at the district level or at any school within the district.

Two new verification reports have been added to the NSSRS Validation website available through the NDE Portal under the Student & Staff (NSSRS) tab. These reports are available in the Verification Reports > Student > Student Grades menu:

**-Delivery Model Counts:** shows a count of how many class sections at a school were reported with a delivery model other than "Classroom" through your Student Grades template in the current year compared to the previous year

**-Dual Credit Counts:** shows a count of how many class sections per school and per course code were reported with dual enrolled students through your Student Grades template in the current year compared to the previous year.
