The purpose of the conference is to support school and district improvement efforts focused on the tenets of AQuESTT (i.e., College and Career Ready; Educator Effectiveness; Assessment; Positive Partnerships, Relationships & Student Success; Transitions; and Educational Opportunities and Access). Staff Reporting 2015-2016 upload option will be open April 1. Please **DO NOT** utilize this option unless you can upload all staff from the beginning of the school year with their original assignment(s) and add their new assignments, otherwise; the original data will be wiped out. The data downloads are available to download the staff data as you see it right now, you could download the file and make changes on the downloaded file and reupload, but that might be more work than using the online system (see below). **REMINDER:** if you upload all staff and some staff have left or been reassigned, report their original assignment with a completion date [Staff

Position Assignments(14):Completion Date] and add a new assignment if appropriate. Do not delete the staff person or change their original assignment to the current assignment.

**Recommended option:** make small changes to individual staff using the online method to avoid losing data if you cannot replicate the original file and add the changes mentioned above. If staff have left or been reassigned, leave their original assignment and add completion date [Staff Position Assignments(14):Completion Date] to the assignment and add a new assignment if appropriate. Do not delete the staff person or change their original assignment to the current assignment.



**DHHS Superintendent Letter – OPENS: April 10**

Beginning on April 10, the DHHS Superintendent Letter will be available for districts to review. This collection can be found under the Data Collections tab in the NDE Portal. The DHHS Superintendent Letter was developed by the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services - Division of Children and Family Services to notify school districts when any of their students become state wards and their current status in the child welfare system. Historically, these letters were mailed or faxed to the Superintendent and Principal of the school where the state ward was enrolled. This project automates that process, ensuring the timely, secure and accurate delivery of the DHHS Superintendent Letter.



**REVISED NSSRS Student Validation Error**

Validation Error 571 has been revised. The error was updated to only validate against students who 1) have a Special Education Snapshot **and** 2) have a Placement Type other than 4. Previously, this error also validated against students who did not have a Special Education Snapshot; this portion of the validation has been removed.

**Error #571 - STUDENT Resident District is different from Reporting District (County District Number), but SCHOOL ENROLL Residence Status = Not Applicable – (STUDENT & SCHOOL ENROLL)** The Resident District (District of Residence) listed in STUDENT is different from the District (County District Number), but the Residence Status listed in SCHOOL ENROLL is (0) Not Applicable. If the Residence District is different from the District where the student is enrolled, then a Residence Status must be listed. (Only applies to Public Districts with Special Education snapshot with placement type other than '4 - Nonpublic Placement - Parental Placement, Special Education Services, Student on Equitable Services Plan')

The 2014-2015 Special Education Performance Reports are now available on the ILCD 2.0 secure site for School District and Planning Region Team review. The audit window provides an opportunity for school districts/PRTs to review their data and see how it compares with the state target. As public schools are completing consultations with nonpublic schools for the 2016-17 school year, please note an assurance regarding MSP has been added to the form. The following information provides a brief explanation as to why the assurance has been added and may be shared during the consultation.

The MSP program provides optional professional development activities for teachers that are sustained, intensive, classroom focused, and aligned with Nebraska mathematics and science standards. Mathematics and

science teachers from high-need school buildings who participate must attend at least 84 hours of professional development activities.

Nonpublic school participation. The MSP grant program is governed by the *Uniform Provisions*, and requires the equitable participation of teachers who teach in nonpublic schools located within the geographic boundaries of public school buildings of participating teachers. For purposes of submitting the proposal, any nonpublic schools geographically located within the boundaries of the high-need public school buildings identified as participating in the partnership must be consulted prior to submission of the proposal. This collection is considered for each school district's annual federally required "determination".

IDEA Part B Special Education Maintenance of Effort (MOE) Application for Compliance Standard for school year 2014-2015 will open on March 15, 2016. The report may be accessed within the NDE Portal under the Data Collection tab.

School district receipt of IDEA dollars is contingent upon maintaining fiscal effort for Special Education. Districts must expend a greater or equal amount of local or local/state funds from one year to the next to meet the MOE requirement. Final calculations based on actual special education school district expenditures/receipts/data obtained from the 2014-2015 AFR and NSSRS are available and have been compared to the highest levels of fiscal effort. As a result, calculations for meeting the IDEA MOE Compliance Standard may have resulted in a MOE excess or shortage that requires school district review for determination of adjustments or credits that could modify the MOE level.
