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WISE, LARSEN RE-ELECTED TO LEAD STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION



Rachel Wise of Oakland and Lillie Larsen of Lincoln were re-elected today to leadership posts on the State Board of Education.

Wise was re-elected president of the State Board of Education. Larsen was re-elected vice president. Both Wise and Larsen have served on the State Board of Education since 2013.

Wise is a retired Nebraska teacher and administrator. She has spent 37 years serving both rural and urban school districts.
