LEGISLATIVE REPORT

On Wednesday, March 9, 2011, NSNA President Gaylene Glenn and I returned from the 39th annual School Nutrition Association Legislative Action Conference (LAC), which was in Washington, DC. Over 850 attended the LAC this year.

Bev Benes, Director of Nebraska Children Nutrition Programs, was with Gaylene and me when we met with our congressional members and their aides. We thanked them for passing the reauthorization of child nutrition programs in December. We told them of all the good things the reauthorization was going to do for the school lunch and breakfast programs.

Of the four issues on the 2011 Issue Paper only one had anything to do with “money”, which was asking for ten cents per breakfast in USDA commodities. The other issues were: Section 205, “Equity in School Lunch Pricing”. Section 307, requesting a list from the Secretary what are the direct costs schools can take from lunch program funds. The last issue on this years Issue Paper is, ask congress to develop a standard contract that school districts can use dealing with food service management companies.

On Monday, during the conference, Former U.S. President Bill Clinton was a Special Guest Speaker. He expressed gratitude to our profession of serving school children. He said “The system is rigged against you serving healthy school meals”. He said children today have such a hard time making the right decisions dealing with what they eat each day.

On Wednesday morning we attended the Nebraska Breakfast in the Dirksen Senate Office Building. During the breakfast we visited with all five of our Nebraska representatives and they heard a summary our child nutrition issues.

HealthierUS School Challenge (HUSSC)



What's HUSSC?

Many schools in Nebraska are taking a leadership role in improving their schools' environments by helping students learn to make healthy eating and active lifestyle choices. In responding to these efforts, The United States Department of Agriculture USDA's Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) has established HUSSC to encourage schools to go further and to recognize those who chose to do so.

Is my school qualified for HUSSC?

The HUSSC is open to all schools participating in the National School Lunch Program.

What are HUSSC criteria?

HUSSC targets four main areas of improvement: food service, nutrition education, physical education/activity,

and school wellness policy. For more information, please visit Team Nutrition website at <http://www.fns.usda.gov/tn/healthierus/vision.html>

What are HUSSC levels?

Four levels of superior performance are awarded: Bronze (\$500), Silver (\$1000), Gold (\$1500) and Gold of Distinction Award (\$2000) per feeding site (school building). The criteria becomes more challenging as the level moves from Bronze to Silver to Gold to Gold of Distinction. Schools will receive an award plaque and monetary awards.

Your school could receive up to \$5000 if you start applying from Bronze then Silver, Gold and Gold of Distinction Award. Schools that become certified maintain the certification for 4 years from the date they receive the Award.

How can my school apply for HUSSC?

You can start by contacting Zainab Rida, the Team Nutrition Coordinator, Nutrition Services, Nebraska Department of Education. She will provide training and technical assistance to your school by helping you step by step through the application process. Please contact her at Zainab.rida@nebraska.gov or (800) 731-2233.

2011 NTENT

Make plans now to attend the Nebraska Training and Education for Nutrition Teams (NTENT) training program in Lincoln, June 5-10 2011. Participants will need to register early (the deadline is April 8, 2011) since registration is limited to 25. There is a limit of two participants per school district.

Now in its 44th year, over 700 school food service managers and employees have graduated from this training program. School food service managers and employees from across the state study with Nebraska Department of Education Nutrition Services consultants and with food and nutrition faculty from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. The two-year program covers a broad range of topics including nutrition, food safety, menu planning, production skills and presentation techniques while improving their supervisory skills in hands-on food preparation laboratories.

The cost for 2011 NTENT training is \$525. This includes tuition, meals, room (double occupancy), and all materials. An additional fee of \$80 will be paid by participants who request a single room. **No refunds will be issued after April 29, 2011.** Participants must complete the Healthy Edge course online through the School Nutrition Association (SNA) for an additional fee. Further information on how to complete the online Healthy Edge course will be provided to each approved registrant for the Introductory Step in the acceptance letter.

Participants will gain valuable experience planning and

preparing nutritious student-friendly meals, maximizing commodity utilization and marketing the school meals program in your school. Participants will learn firsthand how to increase and maintain student participation by incorporating the latest menu ideas and food service trends. As a result of participating in NTENT, you will increase student satisfaction and improve the "bottom line" through classes, laboratories, and interactions with your peers from across the state.

Once the registration is received and approved, each participant will receive a follow-up acceptance letter with more information on the details about preparing for the NTENT one-week training.
