International Technology and Engineering Educators Association
(ITEEA) for Program Excellence and Teacher Excellence awards.
These are the latest highlights in a string of exciting developments for District 66, which opened a state-of-the-art welding, fabrication, and manufacturing lab for students just months ago.



The Westside High School Engineering and Technology Department has been awarded a 2020 Program Excellence Award, highlighting an exemplary educational program to help students become technologically literate.

In October, Westside Community Schools and the Westside Foundation unveiled the Westside High School Welding, Fabrication, and

Manufacturing Lab, a \$1.2 million dollar facility devoted to trades instruction, paid for through donations to the Westside Foundation. Through community investments and strategic partnerships, students are able to access mentorships, apprenticeships, college credit, and work experience before graduating high school. The lab has since been featured in national publications including $\ensuremath{\textit{The}}$ $\ensuremath{\textit{Welder}}$ and $\ensuremath{\textit{The}}$ $\ensuremath{\textit{Fabricator}}$, as well as corporate publications from Union Pacific and OPPD.
