NEBRASKA FBLA NATIONAL AWARD WINNERS NAMED

More than 400 Nebraska students, advisers, and guests recently attended the Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) National Leadership Conference in Atlanta, Georgia. Nebraska FBLA Middle School and High School members competed June 27- 30 in 79 competitive events and Nebraska FBLA Collegiate members competed June 22-25 in 47 competitive events. More than 16,000 FBLA members from 48 states, as well as U.S. territories and international chapters, attended the conference.

Students attended learning sessions with industry leaders, elected a national student officer team, and competed, with more than 2,000 middle school students, 12,000 high school students, and nearly 800 college students competing in a variety of national events. The National Leadership Conference is the culmination of students' hard work over the previous academic year and an opportunity to showcase the skills and knowledge gained in the classroom.
