**Business Conducted:**

1. **Introductions:** Welcomed new Committee 'B' members Erin DeHart, Tim Anderson and alternate members. Members introduced themselves.
  
2. **Approval of Standing Committee 'B' Minutes from June 10, 2016 meeting:** L. Forester motioned, seconded by S. Smith to approve the June 10, 2016 meeting minutes. Motion approved.
  
3. **Committee moved to Clinical Practice Rubric discussion.** Committee members completed the survey.

- 4. Proposed School Counselor endorsement discussion was held.** The major concern is that a person with this endorsement would then be eligible to continue education and receive an administrative endorsement. It would seem that the shortage problem would better be resolved by changing the Rule 10 requirements.
- 5. Discussion regarding Proposed Work-Based Learning endorsement discussion was held.** However, there were no additional points raised regarding this endorsement.
- 6. Principal Performance Frameworks:** Janine Theiler, NDE, presented information to the committee concerning revisions of the Principal Performance Frameworks. Feedback and suggestions from NCTE members is welcome. Current material is out-of-date and a new draft is being proposed to align with current national standards. Committee members would like to review the document. More detailed and in-depth consideration of several suggestions seems necessary.
- 7. ‘Changes in the larger social culture and how does educator preparation respond’ discussion:**
  - A. Technology has changed the way students learn today. Social media has changed relationships as well. Social media has fed into bullying. The future of the world of work is continually changing and the need to have critical thinking and problem solving skills in place is essential. Digital citizenship is a new arena for instruction.
  - B. The attitude toward testing is not keeping up with the technology or with methods of teaching.
  - C. Continually changing social issues are not being addressed. These have become school problems as well. Examples include incarcerated mothers, refugee resettlement, homeless families, depression and anxiety about the future.
- 8. What are the top critical dispositions necessary for today’s teachers?**

Teachers need to be a collaborator, problem solver, builder of relationships, and comfortable with technology. Teachers need to have enduring optimism that all children can learn. What can NCTE do? Continue to keep high standards for those who enter the profession.
