Skills for Learning Academic Development

- Effective learning in school & across the life span
- Academic preparation for post-secondary options
- Relationship of academics, work, family & community life

Examples: College Readiness, Importance of Graduation, Academic Planning, Test Preparation, Study Skills

Skills for Earning Career Development

- Investigate the world of work to make informed decisions
- Strategies to achieve future career goals
- Relationship of personal qualities, education, training & work

Examples: Career Readiness, Personal Learning Plan, Decision Making, Goal Setting, Financial Aid for College

Skills for Living Personal/Social Development

- Interpersonal skills to respect self & others
- Decision making, setting goals & taking action to achieve goals
- Understanding everyday safety & survival skills

Examples: Coping/Resiliency, Anti-bullying, Dating Violence, Citizenship, Character Education, Peer Pressure



Recommendations

- Deliver a *Comprehensive Program* based on Nebraska/ASCA national model standards
- Goal: 80% of School Counselor time in activities that directly benefit student achievement
- Increase teamwork between Principals and Counselors
- Increase Family Engagement
- Lower student-to-counselor ratios
- Implement *Personal Learning Plans* to prepare ALL students for College and Career Readiness
