# MSIX Overview

- ▶ MSIX facilitates the exchange of migrant student records to ensure the appropriate enrollment, placement, and accrual of credits for migrant children nationwide.
  - ▶ All Nebraska information on MSIX is collected from Nebraska's statewide data system, MIS2000.

# MSIX Minimum Data Elements

- ▶ Each State educational agency (SEA) must collect, maintain, and submit minimum educational and health information to MSIX
  - ▶ The regulations are designed to facilitate timely school enrollment, grade and course placement, accrual of secondary course credits, and participation in the MEP for migratory children.
  - ▶ The regulations ultimately will help the Department to determine more accurate migratory child counts and meet other MEP reporting requirements.

# MSIX Minimum Data Elements

(Revised 8/4/16)

- ▶ Student IDs
  - MSIX ID
  - State ID = MIS2000 ID
  
- ▶ Student Information – collected from COE
  - Full name
  - Sex
  - DOB & verification type
  - Multiple birth flag
  - Birth city, state, country

# MSIX Minimum Data Elements

(Revised 8/4/16)

- ▶ Parent Information – collected from COE
  - Parent full names
  - Guardian full names
  
- ▶ Eligibility information – collected from COE
  - Qualifying Arrival Date (QAD)
    - Eligibility Expiration Date (calculated from QAD or student DOB)
  - Qualifying move–from city, state, country
  - Qualifying move–to city, state, country

# MSIX Minimum Data Elements

- Res Date/Enroll/Withdraw/Verification dates
- Enroll type
- Facility Name/Address/Phone/District
- Grade
- District of Residence
- Designated Graduation School
- Project Name/Type
- Continuation of Services Reason
- Out of State Transcript Indicator
- Home School Indicator
- Graduation/HSE Date & Indicator
- Algebra I or Equivalent Indicator

# MSIX Minimum Data Elements

- ▶ Student Needs
  - LEP Indicator
  - IEP Indicator
  - PFS Flag
  
- ▶ Student Health
  - Med Alert Indicator (Cronic/Acute/None)
  - Immunization Record Flag

# MSIX Minimum Data Elements

- ▶ Student Assessment
  - Title, Content, Type
  - Administration Date
  - Reporting Method
  - Score Results
  - Interpretation

# MSIX Minimum Data Elements

(Revised 8/4/16)

- ▶ **Course History**
  - **Course Title**
  - **Subject Area Name**
  - **Course Type**
  - **Academic Year**
  - **Course Section**
  - **Term Type**
  - **Clock Hours**
  - **Grade-to-Date**
  - **Credits Granted**
  - **Final Grade**


