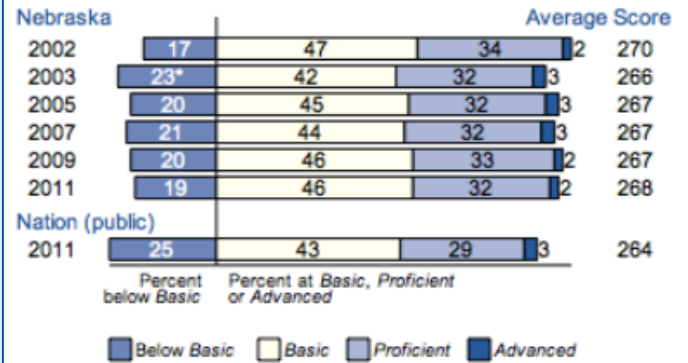


Overall Results

- In 2011, the average score of eighth-grade students in Nebraska was 268. This was higher than the average score of 264 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Nebraska in 2011 (268) was not significantly different from their average score in 2009 (267) and in 2002 (270).
- In 2011, the score gap between students in Nebraska at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 40 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 2002 (37 points).
- The percentage of students in Nebraska who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 35 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (35 percent) and in 2002 (36 percent).
- The percentage of students in Nebraska who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 81 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (80 percent) and in 2002 (83 percent).

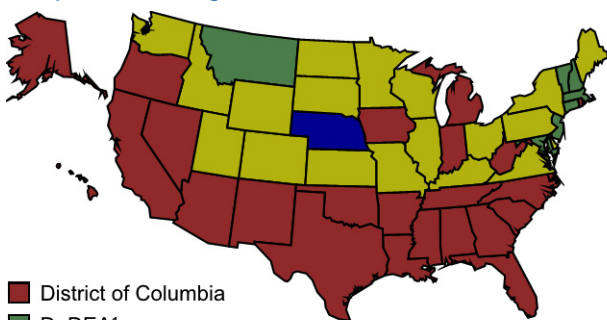
Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results

Compare the Average Score in 2011 to Other States/Jurisdictions

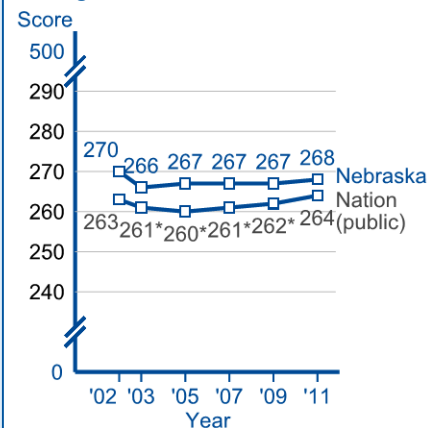

In 2011, the average score in **Nebraska** (268) was

- lower than those in 8 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 24 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 19 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2011, Black students had an average score that was 22 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (27 points).
- In 2011, Hispanic students had an average score that was 20 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (22 points).
- In 2011, female students in Nebraska had an average score that was higher than male students by 9 points.
- In 2011, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 21 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was wider than that in 2002 (15 points).
