

WHAT IS TRAFFICKING?

Trafficking is modern day slavery. Those who have been trafficked worked for an individual who has either tricked them or used threats against the survivor or someone that survivor cares for in order to get them to engage in sexual activity or labor activities.

Money, favors, drugs, or other things of value are exchanged for this service, but typically the survivor sees very little to no profit for their work. In the case of sex trafficking, many times traffickers promise a romantic relationship to lead men and women into sex work for their own personal gain.

Under federal and state law, anyone under the age of 18 exchanging sexual acts for something of value is a survivor of sex trafficking. There is no such thing as a child prostitute.

WHAT ABOUT LAW ENFORCEMENT?

We will never ask you to make a report you are uncomfortable making. However, minors must be reported to the Child Protective Services hotline in accordance with state law.

The SAFE-T Program works closely with the Nebraska Human Trafficking Task Force, based out of the Nebraska Attorney General's office, to help survivors and stop traffickers. If you are an adult and interested in reporting the crime committed against you, our Trafficking Specialists are here to connect you with officers to make a report and support you through the legal process.
