





APPENDIX A - DEFINITIONS

Suspension

A disciplinary action resulting in the exclusion of a student from the school building for a specified period of time. This includes both long-term and short-term suspensions.

Expulsion

A disciplinary action resulting in the exclusion from attendance in all schools within the system in accordance with section 79-283. [Ref.§ 79-256(2)]. This includes any students who had removals resulting from violations of the Gun-Free Schools Act (GFSA) of 1994.

Children with Disabilities (IDEA)

A child with an intellectual disability, hearing impairment including deafness, speech or language impairment, visual impairment including blindness, serious emotional disturbance (hereafter referred to as emotional disturbance), orthopedic impairment, autism, traumatic brain injury, developmental delay, other health impairment, specific learning disability, deaf-blindness, or multiple disabilities, and who, by reason thereof, receive special education and related services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) according to an individualized education program (IEP) or individual family service plan (IFSP).

Which children with disabilities (IDEA) are not required to receive educational services? Children with disabilities (IDEA) must receive educational services during any removal of more than 10 school days.

Are parentally-placed private school students with disabilities included in this count? No. Parentally-placed nonpublic school students are not included in the discipline counts.

Handgun

A firearm (such as a revolver or pistol) designed to be held and fired with one hand.

Rifle

For these purposes, rifle is either a "rifle" or a "short-barreled rifle."

- A. The term "rifle" means a weapon designed or redesigned, made or remade, and intended to be fired from the shoulder and designed or redesigned and made or remade to use the energy of an explosive to fire only a single projectile through a rifled bore for each single pull of the trigger.
- B. The term "short-barreled rifle" means a rifle having one or more barrels less than sixteen inches in length and any weapon made from a rifle (whether by alteration, modification, or otherwise) if such weapon, as modified, has an overall length of less than twenty-six inches.

Shotgun

For these purposes, shotgun is either a "shotgun" or a "short-barreled shotgun."

A. The term "shotgun" means a weapon designed or redesigned, made or remade, and intended to be fired from the shoulder and designed or redesigned and made or remade to use the energy of an

explosive to fire through a smooth bore either a number of ball shot or a single projectile for each single pull of the trigger.

B. The term "short-barreled shotgun" means a shotgun having one or more barrels less than eighteen inches in length and any weapon made from a shotgun (whether by alteration, modification or otherwise) if such a weapon as modified has an overall length of less than twenty-six inches.

Other

Any firearm (see definition below) that is not a handgun, or a rifle, or a shotgun.

More Than One Type

Counts where multiple types of firearms were brought to school in the same incident.

Firearm

A firearm is defined in Title 18 USC §921, Definitions as follows:

- A. any weapon (including a starter gun) which will or is designed to or may readily be converted to expel a projectile by the action of an explosive;
- B. the frame or receiver of any such weapon;
- C. any firearm muffler or firearm silencer; or
- D. any destructive device. Such term does not include an antique firearm.

Destructive Device

The term "destructive device" used in part (D) of the definition of "firearm" means

- A. any explosive, incendiary, or poison gas:
 - i. bomb,
 - ii. grenade,
 - iii. rocket having a propellant charge of more than four ounces,
 - iv. missile having an explosive or incendiary charge of more than one-quarter ounce,
 - v. mine, or
 - vi. device similar to any of the devices described in the preceding clauses;
- B. any type of weapon by whatever name known which will, or which may be readily converted to, expel a projectile by the action of an explosive or other propellant, and which has any barrel with a bore of more than one-half inch in diameter; and
- C. any combination of parts either designed or intended for use in converting any device into any destructive device described in subparagraph (A) or (B) and from which a destructive device may be readily assembled.

Gun-Free Schools Act

The Gun-Free Schools Act (GFSA) Part F of Title XIV of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965 requires that each State have in effect a State law requiring local educational agencies (LEAs) to expel from school for a period of not less than one year a student found to have brought a weapon to school. In addition, under the GFSA, LEAs receiving ESEA funds must adopt a policy requiring referral to the criminal justice or juvenile delinquency system of any student who brings a firearm to school.

APPENDIX B – EXAMPLES

- 1. A child brings a revolver and a semi-automatic handgun to school. Both of these are handguns, and should be included under HANDGUNS.
 - a. One student
 - b. One incident
- 2. Two brothers bring a rifle and 2 shotguns to school. This should be included under RIFLES/SHOTGUNS.
 - a. Two students
 - b. One incident
- 3. A child brings a live WWII grenade to school. Later in the year, after his suspension is over, he does it again. This should be included under OTHER.
 - a. One student
 - b. Two incidents
- 4. A child brings one revolver (HANDGUNS) and one pipe bomb (OTHER) to school. This should be included under MORE THAN ONE TYPE.
 - a. One student
 - b. One incident
- 5. A child brings a bb gun to school. Items such as toy guns, cap guns, bb guns, and pellet guns do not count as firearms and should not be reported.
