WHAT EDUCATORS SHOULD KNOW



COPYRIGHT

It is important to understand the law. A work of authorship includes literary, written, dramatic, artistic, musical, and certain other types of work.

Copyright: Be in the Know



Ensure creative and ethical use of media and information resources through copyright compliance



Work cannot be used, adapted, copied, or published without the owner's permission



Quoting or crediting the author of a copied work does not satisfy copyright requirements



The Fair Use Doctrine allows educators limited and reasonable use of copyrighted materials as long as it does not interfere with owner's rights



When in doubt about the copyright status of the work or the appropriateness of your use of that work, get permission



All original work, published or unpublished, is protected under copyright when it is created, the creator does not need to file patent or trademark paperwork

CREATIVE COMMONS

Creative Commons licenses allow creators to communicate which rights they reserve and which rights they waive for the benefit of recipients or other creators.



Free and Reuse Rights

RETAIN

Allows the user to make and own copies of work

REUSE

Allows the user to use the work in a wide range of ways

REVISE

Allows the user to adapt, modify, and improve the work

REMIX

Allows the user to combine two or more of the above options

REDISTRIBUTE

Allows the user to share the work(s) with others



Attribution

Others can copy, distribute, display, perform, and remix the work if they credit the creator's name



No Derivatives

Others can only copy, display, or perform verbatim copies of the work



Share Alike

Others can distribute the work only under a license identical to the one the creator has chosen for the work



Non-commercial

Others can copy, distribute, display, perform, or remix the work but for non-commercial purposes only



FAIR USE

"The fair use of copyrighted work, including use by reproduction in copies for purposes such as criticism, comment, news reporting, teaching (including multiple copies for classroom use), scholarship, or research, is not an infringement of copyright."
