



'Get Schooled on Concussions' and 'TACT' (Teacher Acute Concussion Tool)

The Brain Injury Alliance of Nebraska (BIA-NE) leading the Nebraska Concussion Coalition, a multi-agency body which implements action oriented steps to improve concussion awareness and outcomes, is providing a free statewide subscription for Nebraska educators to 'Get Schooled on Concussions' and 'TACT' (Teacher Acute Concussion Tool). TACT is a customized concussion management email based on each teacher's unique responses to an online questionnaire (taking less than five minutes) about their teaching style and is immediately delivered to the teacher's inbox outlining recommendations for environmental and academic content adjustments for the classroom. This identification number must be reported on the child's Teaching Strategies GOLD profile. The GOLD administrators are responsible for ensuring that these identification numbers are within each child's profile.
