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English Learner Program Review

It's that time of year when many districts work on the annual English learner program review. As part of Rule 15 Section 008, districts should conduct an annual review to guide planning, implementation, evaluation and modifications of the district's language instruction educational program (LIEP). This may be part of the overall district school improvement process or done as a separate review. The following are required aspects of the program review:

- An examination of program practices including: identification, LIEP, staffing, standards, assessment, and accommodations, and exit requirements.
- A data analysis including: ELPA21 results, state content assessments, and graduation rates, drop-out rates, and years spent receiving language services. **Note**: other relevant assessment and data may be included.
- A monitoring process for former ELs (up to four years).
- Modifications to the program based on the program review and data analysis.
- A written summary report that is submitted to the district's superintendent and kept on file to be available to the public.

NDE Written Report Guidance

Once the program review is complete, the review team is required to submit a written report summarizing the program review process. The written report can include current program practices, strengths of the program, and suggested modifications. Guidance for the written report can be found on the NDE Title III Website:

- Inclusion of standards in the examination of program implementation practices
- Inclusion of graduation rates, drop-out rates, and years spent receiving language services to the data
- Monitoring the academic progress of former English learners from 2 years to up to 4 years to compare their academic performance to non-ELs.
