


English Learners Newsletter December 2021

2021-2022 ELPA21 Important Dates

- January 11, 2022 NDE data pull for ELPA21 summative testing. All ELs should be identified in your SIS.
- January 24 March 7, 2022 Window to order paper, large print, Braille tests
- February 7 March 18, 2022 ELPA21 Summative Window
- February 21 April 7, 2022 Enter Reason Not Tested Codes
- Early May, 2022 Summative scores available
- After June 30, 2022 Redesignate as English Fluent any ELs who tested proficient.
