# **DATES & DEADLINES**


Automated GMS email announcements are sent to all districts; however, they do not always reference the Perkins grant deadlines.

Date	Activity
May I	Amendments to the current grant are due to NDE
June 15	Secondary Accountability data is due to NDE (districts are obligated to submit this data. Consortiums are not responsible for missing or incomplete data.)
July I	Grant Award Notifications are available for 1/4 the amount of the allocation.
October I	Remaining $\frac{3}{4}$ of the grant award is available and generated in GMS
October 15	Postsecondary Accountability Data is due to NDE

# **ACCOUNTING REMINDERS**

- Time and Effort documentation MUST include:
  - Dates worked, Hours worked, Employee name and/or signature approval
- Pre-approval is REQUIRED and expenditures must be easily connected back to budget and four-year application, as approved.
- Purchase documentation must be dated on or PRIOR to the end of the grant period (June 30th).





# PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT PLAN (PIP)


PIPs are required for recipients who failed to meet at least 90% of the state determined levels of performance for any indicator.

If a recipient has gaps in performance without progress prior to 3<sup>rd</sup> program year, the NDE requires a percentage of Perkins funds be allocated toward remediation.

The NDE may withhold all or portion of allotment if the recipient fails to implement a PIP or if performance target is not met for 2 consecutive years after improvement is identified.






