- Engage Students - with interesting tasks
- Observe - what students can do
- Scaffold/Support - with word banks, linguistic frames
- Reflect and Adapt - monitor progress and plan accordingly

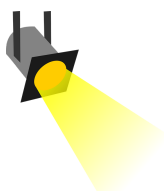
