Under ARP EANS reimbursement is **prohibited.** The State may provide these services or assistance directly to the school or through contract with an individual, association, agency, or organization.

Priority #1 - Not served under ARP EANS:

Consistent with ARP EANS, reimbursement is prohibited. The State may provide these services or assistance directly to the school or through contract with an individual, association, agency, or organization.

Priority #2 - Reimbursement Program:

Reimbursement is allowed for expenses of services and assistance that (1) are of a category that would have been allowable under CRRSA EANS; (2) such service or assistance is not of a category for which reimbursement was prohibited under CRRSA EANS; (3) such expense was not paid using any other source of federal funds; and (4) incurred during or for the 2021-2022 school year and before ARP EANS funds were available for use by Nebraska schools.

Under CRRSA EANS, reimbursement is allowed for expenses of services and assistance (described in the CRRSSA EANS Services & Assistance Document link) except for services and assistance described below:

- Improvements to ventilation systems (including windows), except for portable air purification systems
- Expenses reimbursed through a PPP loan prior to December 20, 2020
- •Staff training and professional development on sanitization, the use of PPE, and minimizing the spread of COVID-19
- Developing instructional plans, including curriculum development, for remote or hybrid learning or to address learning loss
- Initiating and maintaining education and support services or assistance for remote or hybrid learning or to address learning loss

Under CRRSA EANS, reimbursement is allowed for expenses of services and assistance described in the CRRSSA EANS Services & Assistance Document link above that a school incurred on or after March 13. 2020, to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19 except for services and assistance described below:

- Improvements to ventilation systems (including windows), except for portable air purification systems
- Expenses reimbursed through a PPP loan prior to December 20, 2020
- Staff training and professional development on sanitization, the use of PPE, and minimizing the spread of COVID-19 Developing instructional plans, including
