Education for Migratory Children

What is the Title 1C Migrant Education Program (MEP)?

A national program that was created by Congress in 1966 to help children of migratory farm workers be successful in school. In Nebraska, the MEP is a statewide program that recruits and serves migratory children.

Who qualifies?

- Children and youth ages 0-21;
- moved in the past 3 years; and
- worked in agriculture or to accompany a parent or guardian that has worked in agriculture or fishing.

What is agriculture work?

Qualifying work includes but is not limited to:

- dairy work
- meat processing
- field preparation for crops
- harvesting
- livestock
- much more

How does the program help families?

- Qualifying families are eligible to receive free school lunches and parental engagement opportunities.
- Depending on the need, children and youth may receive additional educational and supportive services.

Nebraska Title 1C Migrant Education Programs



With fourteen different sites, the MEP functions as a statewide program that assists schools throughout the State to help migratory children that may be negatively impacted by frequent migration and interrupted schooling to meet State achievement expectations.

Why partner up?

Employers and the Title 1C MEP can both provide referrals to families seeking opportunities.
