- To share personal experiences; and

Sessions address each of these components, emphasizing the importance for youth to examine their higher selves through information, connections, and experiences shared during the Gathering.

WALK TO UNLOCK NEBRASKA

The goal of the program is to increase physical activity opportunities and provide lessons that outline historical,

agricultural, nature and STEAM curricula both during the school day and in the out-of-school time setting across Nebraska. Each participating classroom/after-school club/family will utilize the program to track miles students and adults accumulate on an interactive map leading participants on a virtual trek on one of the four trails being created. Utilizing the interactive website, lessons will allow youth to expand Nebraska-based learning opportunities in the form of a video, books, posters, or curriculum to draw connections to locations across the state through the use of project partner resources highlighting historical, agricultural and nature curricula created in Nebraska.



NURSE'S CORNER



EMERGENCY GUIDELINE

Guidelines for helping an ill or injured student when the school nurse is not available.

The Emergency Guidelines for Schools Manual is meant to provide recommended procedures for school staff that have little or no medical/nursing training to use when the school nurse is not available. It is recommended that staff who are in a position to provide first complete an approved first-- aid to students aid and CPR course. Although designed for a school environment, this resource is equally appropriate for a child care or home setting.

FREE CLEANING & VENTILATION SUPPLIES

Did you know that you can get free cleaning and ventilation supplies for your school? DHHS has the following items available for schools or licensed child care centers to order at no cost:

- · HEPA machines (air purifiers) and replacement filters for 2 years
- HEPA filters for HVAC systems
- Child-sized masks
- Alcohol pads
- Tissues
- Disinfectant wipes
- Gloves
- Trash bags

SCHOOL NURSE SCHOLARS (SNS) PROGRAM

Nursing Students in Public Schools

There is a nursing shortage in Nebraska schools. The CDC recommends there is one nurse for every 750 students, and in Nebraska, there is one nurse for over 1000 students in many school districts. The SNS program is aiming to show more students what school nursing is all about so it can be on their radar once they graduate.

The SNS program will allow nursing students to be placed at K-12 schools across the state and be exposed to a broad overview of public health issues at the local level. The nursing students will work at schools across the state that already have nurses. While in the program, students will participate in a comprehensive program including needs assessments, school testing, health education and additional support to keep the general population safe. In addition, students will be able to attend seminars and trainings offered by DHHS throughout their enrollment.
