- Next steps for addressing educator shortage State Educator Shortage Committee met; goal was to provide goals to present to State Board. Three actionable items to present to the Board:
 - Need to retain people longer Possibly a survey used to know why educators stay in the profession
 - Mandates Mandated trainings need to be done more efficiently, and look at instructional mandates, such as 1080-hour requirement
 - Mentorships Could partner with personnel on educational mentorships; a positive spin on education as a profession is needed
- Next steps for new and current member development how do we keep good teachers in the
 profession? Perhaps compare the number of active teachers versus inactive teachers with current
 teacher certificates in the state. There is a need to hold the NCTE pre-meeting with new members so
 they can learn more about NCTE, specifically at the October meeting.
- Commissioner search update New Commissioner, Brian Maher, approved by state board.
- Special Education endorsement ad hoc committee meeting will take place in May. Any
 recommendations will be presented at the August 25 NCTE Executive Committee meeting. Perhaps
 devise a document explaining all the changes in SPED endorsements to help new NCTE members
 understand the SPED revisions.
