



WHAT IS THE SEAL OF BILITERACY?

The Seal of Biliteracy is an award given by the State of Nebraska in recognition of high school students who have studied and attained proficiency in two or more languages by high school graduation.

WHY APPLY?

The Seal of Biliteracy can be reflected on a student's high school transcript. The Seal honors students' bilingual proficiency and serves as evidence of skills that are attractive to future employers and college admissions offices nationwide.

WHO SHOULD APPLY?

Any multilingual high school student who can demonstrate proficiency in English and at least one language other than English.

ARE YOU FLUENT IN TWO LANGUAGES?

Are you proficient in English, demonstrated through ONE of the following?

- AAPPL Assessment in English (score of I-3 or higher)
- AP English Language and Composition (score of 3 or higher)
- ACT (composite English Language Arts score of 18 or higher)
- ELPA21 (combination scores of 4 or higher)
- High school transcript showing 30 credits of English Language Arts with course content that includes composition, verbal communication, literature, research skills, and technical reading and writing.
- SAT (composite English score of 480 or higher)
- STAMP 4S Assessment in English (score of 5)

- PLUS -

Are you proficient in a language other than English, demonstrated through ONE of the following?

- AAPPL Assessment
- ACTFL Latin Interpretive Reading Assessment (ALIRA)
- Advanced Placement (AP)
- ALTA Language Tests
- International Baccalaureate (IB) Overall Language B Assessment
- STAMP 4S Assessment
- High school transcript showing completion of six semesters of Language
 Heritage/Native speakers with course content that includes composition,
 verbal communication, literature, research skills, and technical reading and
 writing.
