- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; and to adopt the Nebraska Farm-To-
- 2 School Program Act.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Sections 1 to 7 of this act shall be known and may be

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- 2 cited as the Nebraska Farm-to-School Program Act.
- 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of this act:
- 4 (1) Food means an agricultural commodity or product, whether raw or
- 5 processed, that is produced and marketed for human consumption; and
- 6 (2) Program means the Nebraska farm-to-school program as established
- 7 in section 3 of this act.

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- 8 Sec. 3. A Nebraska farm-to-school program is established to be
- 9 administered on a statewide basis by the State Department of Education.
- 10 Sec. 4. (1) The program shall provide for the purchase of locally
- 11 <u>and regionally produced or processed food in order to improve child</u>
- 12 <u>nutrition and strengthen local and regional farm economies.</u>
- 13 (2) The program shall link elementary and secondary public and
- 14 nonpublic schools in this state with Nebraska farms in a manner that
- 15 provides schools with fresh and minimally processed food for inclusion in
- 16 school meals and snacks, encourages children to develop healthy eating
- 17 habits, and improves the incomes of Nebraska farmers who will enjoy
- 18 direct access to consumer markets.
- 19 <u>(3) The program may include activities that provide students with</u>
- 20 hands-on learning opportunities, including, but not limited to, farm
- 21 visits, cooking demonstrations, and school gardening and composting
- 22 programs, and that integrate nutrition and agricultural education into
- 23 the school curricula.
- 24 Sec. 5. The State Department of Education shall employ a
- 25 <u>coordinator to administer the program. The duties of such coordinator</u>
- 26 shall include:
- 27 (1) Identifying and promoting the critical ways for local
- 28 <u>communities to participate in the program and advise communities on</u>
- 29 <u>needed strategies, plans, and action to administer the program;</u>
- 30 (2) Establishing a partnership with public agencies and nonprofit
- 31 organizations to implement a public engagement campaign and establish a

- 1 structure to facilitate communication between farmers and schools;
- 2 (3) Providing leadership at the state level to encourage schools to
- 3 <u>develop</u> and <u>improve</u> school nutrition plans using locally or regionally
- 4 grown or locally or regionally processed food;
- 5 (4) Conducting workshops and training sessions and providing
- 6 technical assistance to school food services, farmers, processors, and
- 7 distributors regarding the demand for and the availability of Nebraska
- 8 <u>food products</u>, and assisting persons seeking to participate in the
- 9 program;
- 10 <u>(5) Providing information regarding the program in an electronic</u>
- 11 <u>format on the web sites for the State Department of Education and the</u>
- 12 <u>Department of Agriculture; and</u>
- 13 (6) Seeking financial or in-kind contributions to support the
- 14 program.
- 15 Sec. 6. The Department of Agriculture and the State Department of
- 16 Education shall cooperate in administering the program and shall each
- 17 provide professional consultation and staff support.
- 18 Sec. 7. It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate one
- 19 hundred thousand dollars from the General Fund to the State Department of
- 20 Education each fiscal year. Such funds shall be used for purposes of
- 21 supporting the program, including, but not limited to, salaries, support,
- 22 maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes.
