We are pleased to announce that iSOSY will continue working in partnership with Fort Scott Community College to offer the OSHA 10-Hour General Industry Course to **one student** from each of the consortium states. Preference should be given to students who are Out-of School Youth (OSY) but a secondary at-risk youth may also be nominated to take the course. Please note that service providers will need to have approval by their MEP state director in order to submit the application.

The course begins on November 16th for students (one per state) in either **English** or **Spanish**. The OSHA 10-Hour General Industry Course graduates will receive their OSHA 10-Hour Wallet Card and completion certificates.

A successful **student** will be motivated to pursue and complete a self-paced, self-directed course. (Bilingual support is available throughout the course.)

**Service providers** must commit to frequent check-ins with their student(s) to engage with them as often as necessary to keep them motivated and on track. While service providers will not have direct access to the course, the facilitator is available to them at any time to discuss ways to help support the student. (More details will be discussed at the **mandatory** Service Provider Introductory Meeting on November 9.)





The Standard Response Protocol (SRP) and Standard Reunification Method (SRM) are used for crisis response and post-crisis reunification in more than 30,000 schools, districts, departments, agencies, organizations, and communities around the world.

The Full Day Train the Trainer Workshop introduces the history, concepts, and functionality of these programs and how to train the programs internally.

Participants will walk away from the workshop with a deep understanding of how the SRP provides a proven, action-based enhancement to all-hazards school safety planning. After learning about the five actions of the SRP, and their associated directives, participants will be able to implement the program and enhance the safety plans of their school/district.

Additionally, participants will gain an understanding of the proven methods for planning, practicing, and achieving a successful reunification using the SRM. They will walk away from the training with the ability to organize a reunification team in their school/district and create an effective reunification plan.



The Nebraska Judicial Branch is commemorating the Legislature's passage of Neb. Rev. Stat. §25-2401 — Interpreters; public policy.

This milestone not only acknowledges our commitment to a fair and impartial legal system, but also highlights the need for continued progress and improvement to ensure deaf, hard of hearing, and limited English proficient (LEP) court users have access to our courts and probation services.

Before the implementation of language access services in the Nebraska Judicial Branch, individuals who did not speak English faced significant barriers when seeking justice. They often struggled to understand court proceedings, couldn't effectively communicate with their attorneys and were at a disadvantage when trying to defend their rights; likewise, judges, jurors and lawyers could not understand non-English speaking litigants and witnesses.

# **Data Resources**

XLOOKUP is one of the best new functions in Excel. With Xlookup you can search two separate data ranges a lot easier than with Vlookup. Xlookup always searches for the exact match by default! Search Horizontally or Vertically. Use this function to find missing students between two lists.

When the Consulate of Guatemala officially opens in a few weeks, it will join the nearby Consulate of El Salvador, which established a local base earlier this year.

The pacesetter Mexican Consulate made its entrance back in 2000.

While separate entities, the three embassy-like satellites collectively reflect the growing influence of Latino immigrants, who account for about half the state's estimated 150,000 or so foreign-born residents.

Consider this data, from the U.S. Census Bureau and the Immigration Research Initiative:

- Foreign-born Nebraskans of all nationalities make up more than 7% of Nebraskans.
- That group represents 9% of Nebraska's labor force and 8% of its earnings.
- Mexico, Guatemala and El Salvador represent three of the top four countries with the most expatriates in Nebraska (India is the other).

The <u>National Dropout Prevention Center</u> (NDPC) exists to support those who work to improve student success and graduation rates. NDPC offers a wide range of resources and services to schools, districts, regional agencies, and states at no cost or at cost. You can download posters, tent cards and bookmarks to help spread the word during the month of October.

High dropout rates among migratory students are related to low school engagement and attendance. Therefore, the ideas and strategies contained within iSOSY's **Dropout Prevention: Strategies to Assist School Engagement and Attendance** were developed to address these issues with migratory secondary students. While the noted strategies could be useful for all students, migratory students often have added barriers to school engagement. The strategies and their applications are designed to help staff work with migratory students who experience low levels of school engagement.






iSOSY created <u>Goal Setting</u> materials to give service providers and students a platform to discuss the importance of setting goals and the tools to get there. Those working many years in migrant education noticed that students - OSY in particular - are often confused when asked about their goals. Many have never had the opportunity to really think about what they would like to accomplish in their lives - academically or otherwise.



iSOSY also has <u>Pathway Guides</u> to help re-engage OSY along the pathways to HSED or credentials. Today, more than ever, having a high school education enables one to be more prepared for further learning and to have productive employment and a stable life. Credential/certification programs offer powerful opportunities to engage students. These programs can stand alone or be integrated as part of a high school or college education. They can be offered via a school district, through other local municipal offices, or through non-profit organizations. These guides will help service providers and students determine the best next steps.

The iSOSY <u>Career Awareness Toolkit</u> helps you and your student explore themes that are important when thinking about the student's future. It is designed for the service provider to address one unit, or even one question, at a time if there are time constraints. The toolkit can be used as part of an ongoing, deeper interaction with a student or as part of a one-time conversation. Remember that any extra information you can share can make a big difference later!



Additionally, you can also download a myriad of other resources to support dropout prevention. NDPC now offers online professional development in dropout prevention strategies for purchase in each of the 15 research-based Effective Strategies for Dropout Prevention. These 60-to-90-minute self-paced courses take participants through an exploration of what the strategy is, how it fits within the 15 Effective Strategies model, and the research supporting it, allowing participants to envision for themselves how the strategy can be implemented. 
