**Decide what you will crunch and where you will get it from!** If you would like to crunch something other than an apple, please refer to the State-specific resources provided upon registration, or reach out to Sarah Meyer (sarah.m.meyer@nebraska.gov) Crunch events can take place anywhere, even during school breakfasts, lunches, after school snacks, or via the Fresh Fruit & Vege-table Program.

**Create a Crunch Team & get as many people involved as you can!** Gather as many individuals as possible in your school/district who are excited about Farm to School and local food. Consider including students, teachers, food service staff, administrators,



the PTA, your wellness committee, and community members to help you plan and promote the event. There's a Crunch Guide to help you get started (available upon registration)!

We look forward to "Crunching Off" together and helping STATE take the title from Nebraska. [Or, for Nebraska: We look forward to...keeping the title in Nebraska for the third year in a row!]
