WHO WE ARE

The Title IC Education Program, also known as the Migrant Education Program (MEP), is a federal program focused in providing supplemental services to migratory children. It is managed by the Nebraska Department of Education. The goal is to see migratory children to excel in school, meet the same academic standards as their peers, and graduate from high school.

THE PURPOSE

- Support educational programs for migratory children.
- Ensure equal treatment for migratory children across states in curriculum, graduation requirements, and academic standards.
- Provide coordinated educational services to address the unique needs of migratory children.
- Ensure migratory children meet challenging academic standards.
- Help migratory children overcome barriers to academic success and transition to postsecondary education or employment.
- Ensure migratory children benefit from systemic reforms.

SERVICES

May include the following:

- Instructional support
- Parent Advisory Council (PAC), which conducts meetings and other parent involvement activities
- Instructional and support services
- Automatic qualification to free school lunch
