PERKINS CLAIMS FOR REIMBURSEMENT

SOME OF THE THINGS THAT GET MISSED

- Time and Effort documentation:
 - Employee name and/or Administrator signature approval
 *Description of work performed that references Perkins/CTE.
- Purchase documentation must be dated on or PRIOR to the end of the grant period (June 30th). Purchase Order copies are necessary and requested when the Invoice copies are dated after June 30.
- Pre-approval for expenditures is <u>REQUIRED</u>, (this includes working lunches) and expenditures must be easily connected back to budget and four-year application, as approved. Contact your NDE Monitor.


PERKINS CLAIMS FOR REIMBURSEMENT

SOME OF THE THINGS THAT GET MISSED

- Annual Budget Expenditure Category Coding- Lodging/Meals for PD Travel Expenditures-400/500
 (Check your budget. The GMS does not allow moving funds between categories with a \$0 budget. Amendments are required.)
- Annual Subscriptions- NDE's Office of Grant Compliance has validated that subscriptions cannot be purchased for longer than the 12-month Grant Period.
- All Socials and Banquets are considered Entertainment and cannot be reimbursed with Perkins Grant Funds.

The requirement for grantees (NDE) to monitor their subrecipients is found in 2 CFR 200.332.


Advance CTE relaunched the Advancing the Framework:

A State-led Initiative to Modernize the National Career Clusters® Framework.

- Career Clusters have served an organizational tool for career pathways and industry groupings since 2002. Many believe it is no longer truly reflective of the current world of work.
- A National Advisory Committee and Industry Advisory Groups were created to provide expert insight and industry-specific information throughout the process. There will be multiple opportunities for educators to provide input.
- The updated Framework will be finalized by the end of 2024.

The National Career Clusters Framework provides structural alignment and a common language to bridge education and work, empowering each learner to explore, decide, and prepare for dynamic and evolving careers.

STATE CTE INVESTMENT!

- •\$5,116,000 to be distributed between secondary and postsecondary CTE programs
 - •Minimum \$7,500 per LEA
- •\$200,000 for Career and Technical Student Organizations (CTSOs)
 - •DECA, Educators Rising, FBLA, HOSA, FCCLA, FFA, SkillsUSA





reVISION – New Timeframe* for 2024-2025 Action Grant!

- October 20, 2023: Announce new grant timeline
 - Visit the <u>reVISION Action Grant</u> web page for full details
- November 20, 2023: Application & guidance docs become available and submission site opens
- March 22, 2024: Applications due by 5:00 pm CST
- June 7, 2024: Grant awards announced (following State Board of Education approval)
- July 1, 2024- June 30, 2025: Grant Award Period
- August 21, 2025: Final Reimbursement Requests (Closeouts) Due

reVISION – 2024-2025 Action Grant Eligibility


- Any individual secondary or postsecondary Perkins recipient (stand-alone or consortia) or combination of recipients*, are eligible to apply for this grant.
- Each applicant (including collaborators) must be participating in the regular, formulabased Perkins grant program for the fiscal year of the application.
- Per Section I I2(c), each applicant must meet at least one of the following criteria for serving a specific target population:
 - Rural areas (located outside of Omaha/Lincoln metropolitan areas);
 - Areas with high percentages of CTE students (50% or more of 9-12 population, unduplicated),
 - Areas with high numbers of CTE students (9-12 student population of 300+, unduplicated), or
 - Areas with disparities or gaps in performance

^{*} If a group of Perkins recipients choose to collaborate for a reVISION Action Grant, they must designate a single fiscal agent from that group.

reVISION - 2024-2025 Action Grant Application

- Each application must clearly outline how the project proposed addresses a minimum of two of Nebraska CTE's Perkins V strategic priorities.
- Applications should include specific strategies designed to address equity gaps for special populations in CTE and promote strategic partnerships; including secondary, postsecondary, and industry partnerships.
- For applicants in rural areas, details on how the proposed project addresses barriers to implementing high-quality CTE in rural areas should also be included.
- Activities must be directly related to the implementation of the reVISION action steps identified throughout the reVISION process and updated through the reVISION reFRESH process.
