

TITLE I ELIGIBILITY WORKSHEET FOR 2023-24 SCHOOL YEAR

***Federal Census Data is used to determine eligibility for School Districts
with a census population of 20,000 or more.***

Step 1: BASIC GRANT: Formula Count Calculation - Section 1124

To be eligible for a Basic Grant, an LEA must have at least 10 children counted under the Title I formula **and** the number of formula children must be greater than 2 percent of the LEA's school-age population.

CONCENTRATION GRANT: Low-Income Percentage Calculation - Section 1124A

To be eligible for a Concentration Grant an LEA must generally have more than 6,500 formula children **or** the number of formula children must exceed 15 percent of the LEA's school-age population.

***Hold Harmless Levels: Section 1122 (c)**

Amounts for Sections 1124, 1124A*, 1125 and 1125A – for each fiscal year, the amount made available to each local educational agency under each of Sections 1124, 1124A, 1125 and 1125A shall be –

- (A) not less than 95 percent of the amount made available for the preceding fiscal year if the number of children counted for grants under Section 1124 is not less than 30 percent of the total number of children aged 5 to 17 years, inclusive, in the local educational agency;
- (B) not less than 90 percent of the amount made available for the preceding fiscal year if the percentage described in subparagraph (A) is between 15 percent and 30 percent; and
- (C) not less than 85 percent of the amount made available for the preceding fiscal year if the percentage described in subparagraph (A) is below 15 percent.

**TARGETED GRANT – Section 1125 and
EDUCATION FINANCE INCENTIVE GRANT – Section 1125A:
Formula Count Calculation**

To be eligible for a Targeted Grant and/or Education Finance Incentive Grant an LEA must have at least 10 formula children **and** that number must be at least 5 percent of the LEA's school-age population.
