Alt ELPA Assessment and Alt ELP Standards

During the school year 2021-22, Nebraska participated in the pilot of the Alt ELPA Assessment with Grand Island as the pilot district. In 2022-23, we had the field test with 132 students participating in the Alt ELPA Assessment. This year, 2023-24, is the operational test for the Alt ELPA Assessment. The Alternate English Language Proficiency Assessment (Alt ELPA) is designed to measure students' English proficiency, which supports students' ability to access, engage with, and learn grade-level academic content taught in English. It was developed through the Collaborative for the Alternate Assessment of English Language Proficiency (CAAELP) project in collaboration with state and national partners. The Alt ELPA is for those students who have a significant cognitive disability and have been identified as an English learner.

ELPA21 provides <u>online training modules</u> for the Alt ELPA assessment as well as the screener and summative assessments. The <u>Nebraska Portal</u> has practice opportunities and helpful resources such as the <u>Alt ELPA</u> <u>Test Administration Manual</u>, <u>Alt ELPA Test Delivery</u> <u>System Overview</u>, and <u>the Alt ELPA Practice Test</u> <u>Directions and Scoring Rubrics</u>.





In addition to

these resources, NDE has a Community of Practice (Alt ELPA CoP) to support district leaders and staff who work with this population of students. Anyone is welcome to attend

our monthly meetings via zoom. More information can be found on our <u>One Stop Shop</u>.

Guidance: The Office of English Language Acquisition (OELA) within the U.S. Department of Education has published an English Learner Tool Kit with chapter 6 addressing English learners with disabilities. They identify key points such as identifying and evaluating ELs with disabilities in a timely manner and providing EL students with disabilities with both the language assistance and disability-related services they are entitled to under federal law.
