Effective January 1, 2024

New Rate for Mileage Reimbursement (Effective January 1, 2024)

The IRS announced that effective January 1, 2024, the 2024 reimbursement rate is increased to \$.67. Prior to January 1, 2024, the rate was \$.655. Upcoming Due Dates/Dates of Importance

Extraordinary Increase in Special Education Expenditures (New CDC Collection, Due January 15, 2024)

There is a new collection for districts experiencing a significant increase in special education expenditures in the current year that need assistance with cash flow. To qualify, a district must have expected special education expenditures over \$50,000 for 2023/24, special education expenditures must make up over .5% of the district's 2023/24 budget, and the district must have special education expenditures over 107% of half of the 2022/23 special education expenditures from September 1, 2023 through December 2023. If your district would like to apply for early reimbursement of the additional expense in excess of 107% of half of the 2022/23 special education expenditures, please go to the Extraordinary Increase in Special Education Expenditures collection in the Consolidated Data Collection (CDC) section of the NDE Portal. The collection will be open until January 15, 2024, with payments to be made by January 31, 2024. There is a total of \$2.5 million available for early payments with amounts to be pro-rated if requests exceed \$2.5 million. Important – any amount received as part of the extraordinary increase in special education expenditure process will be subtracted from your 2024/25 special education payments.

Textbook Loan Program (Rule 4) / Application for Distribution of Funds (Appendix C) (Due February 15, 2024)

The total 2023/24 appropriation (to be used for book distributions beginning in the 2024/25 school year) is \$1,465,500. For school districts that participate in the Textbook Loan Program, the Application for Distribution of Funds (Appendix C) is due February 15. *Reminder: Completion of the Appendix C is contingent on the Appendix A's (Application for Loan of Textbooks) submitted to your school district by January 15, 2024.

Note that the changes to the Textbook Loan Program as a result of the passage of LB 705 (2023) will not take effect until the 2024/25 school year (for 2025/26 book distributions).

NEW: Consolidated Collection in the NDE Portal: School Bond (Available January 31 2024; Due February 28, 2024)

The School Bond collection is to be completed by the Public Districts who have passed a school bond and will begin taxing on the bond for the first time during the 2023/24 school year. In year 2021, LB 2 passed, which amends Neb. Rev. Stat. 77-201 to provide that all agricultural and horticultural land that receives special valuation, is to be valued at 50% of actual value for the purposes of taxes levied by school districts to pay the principal and interest on bonds approved after January 1, 2023. If your school has had a new school bond passed and you did not begin taxing on this bond during the 2023/24 school year or before, please complete the School Bond collection, once available, in order for the DOE to respond to the request of the Department of Revenue/Property Assessment Division (PAD).

Rule 13 Exempt (Home) Schools – 2023/24 School Year

Starting with the 2023/24 school year, the Exempt Schools – School District Report is report is available via the ADVISER Validation website, located on the NDE Portal (https://portal.education.ne.gov). Please note that this is a different report & location than the previous Exempt School – School District Reports. Information in the old reporting system is no longer edited.

Online filings show up on the school's report immediately upon submission. Paper filings received, to date, are now included in the report.

We are just beginning to review filings & issue the acknowledgement letter. The filings will be reviewed in order received (submitted date). Once reviewed, the students will show an exempt date in the next to last column on the right (if the filing was complete).

The following are <u>not</u> fully or accurately reflected on the school district report. Exempt School staff will send an update to public school superintendents this Friday, January 5th.

- Filings to add a student to an existing 2023/24 exempt school roster.
- Changes of address.
- Changes of enrollment status and cancellations received after the initial submission.
- Rule 13, Form C withdrawn from the exempt school over age 16 & under age 18.
- Rule 13, Form D completed program of instruction (graduated) and under age 18.
