



PARTNERSHIPS



On February 29th, the Columbus Area United Way, in partnership with Catholic Charities, provide 250 food boxes for human service entities working with individuals and families with food access needs. The ESU7 MEP received 50 boxes for families in the program, impacting 195 individuals! This is the 3rd time United Way has provided some of our MEP families with food assistance.

Dental Screening

On March 7th, ESU7 partnered with the University of Nebraska Medical Center to provide 60 students with dental screenings! The screeners provided were absolutely free to ESU7 migrant families. Students were provided with over \$12,000 worth of services during Dental Screening Day! The screeners provide UNMC and staff with a treatment plan for Dental Day on April 19th. Based on treatment plans, we estimate \$40,000 of dental work for all 60 students!

HEALTH CARE

Clinic with a Heart in Lincoln serves uninsured and underinsured individuals in the community. The clinic has provided school physicals for MEP students and has helped with referrals for specialists. Additionally, Clinic with a Heart has served as a primary clinic for MEP parents and has helped these individuals receive free or reduced cost health care and prescription medicine. This is a tremendous resource for not only families we serve, but to many in the community!



March is Women's History Month. During Women's History Month, it is essential to recognize the contributions and challenges faced by migratory farmworker women, especially our migratory mothers and female out-of-school youth (OSY). These women play a crucial role in the agricultural industry but often encounter barriers to accessing resources and support.

Female migratory farmworkers, whether mothers or female OSY, often work long hours under challenging conditions. Recognizing the importance of mental health for these women is crucial, as they may face unique stressors and pressures in their work and home lives. Addressing mental health concerns among women farmworkers is essential for promoting their overall well-being.

Providing access to mental health resources, support networks, and education on self-care can empower women farmworkers to prioritize their mental health and cope effectively with the demands of their work, ultimately enhancing their resilience and quality of life.

Obtaining a high school equivalency diploma can open up a world of opportunities for migratory farmworker youth. By earning this credential, individuals can enhance their career prospects, pursue higher education, and increase their earning potential. High school equivalency programs, such as the GED or HiSET, provide flexible options for those who may face challenges attending traditional high school due to travel commitments or work responsibilities. Empowering migratory farmworker youth with a high school equivalency diploma can lead to a brighter future filled with greater opportunities and success.

The High School Equivalency Program (HEP) offered through the Office of Migrant Education provides a unique opportunity for farmworkers to earn their high school diploma equivalency. This program is designed to cater to the needs of individuals who may face challenges attending traditional high school due to their work

as migratory farmworkers. The program empowers OSY farmworkers to continue their education and advance their careers by offering flexible scheduling and support.
