Working with Older English Learners

Many districts have reached out with questions regarding older ML/EL students. Some of these students come with transcripts and have had no interruption in their education, while others may not have any transcripts and have had interruptions in their education. Students with limited or interrupted formal

education are often referred to as SLIFE students. Specific graduation requirements may differ between districts but all districts have the requirements as set by the <u>State of Nebraska Legislature</u>. One resource that offers support in analyzing transcripts is <u>ValidateMel</u> There is a fee for this service and it is an allowable use under Title III.



Offering students and their families a graduation pathway or plan has been a positive addition for many school districts. Some examples of these plans can be found on the <u>ESU 4</u> <u>Title III Resources Website</u>. There are times when students and families realize there may not be time to get everything needed to graduate from a Nebraska high school. They may want to attend the public school to gain English skills and become acclimated to the community, but they may also want to learn about additional opportunities outside public education. NDE has a GED/Adult Education office that supports efforts across the state.



Many local community colleges offer English Education courses to support literacy and learning. Some of these include <u>Southeast Community College</u>, <u>Central Community College</u>, <u>Metro Community College</u>, and <u>Northeast Community College</u>. These are great resources for older students to access strong English Learner Programs.



Various Communities also offer literacy programs so be sure to check with your local city commerce. For example, <u>Lincoln Literacy</u> has a wonderful English learning community. And there are probably lots of other programs offered across our state!
