- 2. If items were designed to measure national standards but have been determined to be aligned with state specific standards, what, if any, concerns would you have in including these items in a summative item pool?
- 3. We are considering adding constructed response items to all 3 content areas. What would you consider to be effective ways of measuring different aspects of the science and math standards?
- 4. How creative can we get with constructive response items?
- 5. NWEA has indicated hand scoring of CRI will be the method used for the near future. From what you have seen in other states, what are best practices for hand scoring? What should we look for from NWEA?
- 6. We were awarded a CGSA grant. The primary outcome will be improved utility of NSCAS data for educators and families. The project has the following strategic goals:
 - a. Partner with vendor to ensure a responsive item development process considers usability for educators and families
 - Build new NSCAS score reports for educators and families that respond to the specific needs both user groups identify to maximize the usability of the data to inform instruction
 - c. Build user capacity for using assessment data to inform instructional and support decisions via professional learning opportunities and engagement strategies
