The Mental and Behavioral Health Implementation Act identified several key areas of implementation to ensure school districts have the necessary support available to address the health and well-being of Nebraska youth. The legislation requires the following for the 2023-2024 school year:

Behavioral Health Point of Contact-

 By August 1, 2023, each school district shall report to the NDE the Behavioral Health point(s) of contact for each school building via <u>this form</u>. The roles and responsibilities for the Behavioral Health point of contact can be <u>found here</u>.

Behavioral Health Registry-

- By August 1, 2023, the NDE, in consultation with the Division of Behavioral Health at the Department of Health and Human Services, shall provide each school district with a registry of state and local Behavioral Health resources available to work with students and families.
- The Nebraska Network of Care is the statewide registry selected to provide Behavioral Health resources to support students, schools, students, and families.
