“Every CDA® candidate must complete 120 clock hours of professional early childhood education, with no fewer than ten hours in each of the eight CDA® Subject Areas. Candidates may obtain training through two- and four-year colleges, private training organizations or high school Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs. Resource and Referral Agencies and early childhood education programs, such as Head Start and the U.S. military, are also sources for training. A candidate may accumulate hours from a single training program or a combination of programs. Each agency or organization must provide verification of all education in the form of a transcript, certificate or letter on official letterhead. For online CDA® training, electronic certificates are acceptable. The Council accepts in-service training and training from Council-approved state registries, but it does not accept training obtained at conferences nor from individual consultants.”
