Nebraska K-12 schools and their law enforcement partners have access to two types of consultations related the behavioral threat assessment and management. **Learn more at ppcta.unl.edu.**



Find a mental health clinician in your area trained to consult with your team about violence risk.

You can request a list of clinicians who have completed training in violence risk assessment and are willing to be on a list provided to schools and law enforcement. Your school or agency can choose to contact any of the clinicians on the list and speak directly with them about your needs.

EXAMPLE: A school threat team decides referral to a mental health clinician is appropriate and wants the clinician to report back on the conditions that could reduce violence risk for the individual, including recommendations on safely reintegrating the individual in the school setting. The school and parents agree on who is paying for the assessment and request a list of clinicians in their area trained to do this type of assessment.

EXAMPLE: A low resourced school is looking for a mental health clinician familiar with behavioral threat assessment to be part of the school threat team when needed. They request the list of clinicians in their area and work directly with the clinician of their choice to fill this role.



Consult with a Certified Threat Manager about your threat assessment processes.

Consultation with a professional experienced in threat assessment and management may be available free of charge to help your team think through your process as it applies to a case or to help you address questions about how your program is organized.

EXAMPLE: A school has a behavioral threat assessment program but has only a few cases each year. They meet regularly but are unsure if their program is missing anything. They ask for a consultation to help them review their processes (e.g., policy, how they document their work).

EXAMPLE: The school threat assessment team has a complicated case in progress. They ask for a consultation to help them think through the processes they have gone through so far and ask that the consultant suggest any other processes they should be engaged in (e.g., ways to gather information, how to engage community partners relevant to the case, potential management strategies). The team does not divulge information about the person(s) they are working with, but instead focuses on the work the team is doing.
