Practice Opportunities for English Learners to Prepare for the ELPA21 Summative and Alt ELPA Assessment



The Nebraska Cambium Portal offers practice opportunities for the ELPA21 Assessments. Students and families can log on and participate at home and teachers can provide opportunities for students at school. The ELPA21 practices are presented by grade bands and domains. Resources provide the number of items for the ELPA21 and Alt ELPA practice tests. In addition, the Alt ELPA has practice directions and scoring rubrics. The advantages of using the ELPA21 Practice Opportunities include exposure to the testing platform, becoming familiar with the types of test items, and using the tools

such as zoom, highlighting, and mark for review. Some teachers have used the various domain practice tests periodically throughout the first semester and some provide exposure to all of the practice tests in January just prior to the summative testing window. When students and teachers are comfortable with the testing platform and tools, they can focus on their performance when they take the summative assessment.

In addition to the practice opportunities offered through Cambium, ELPA21 has created Toolkits with tasks that provide practice in all four domains. The first year (2021) the EL Educator Toolkit was free to all educators. The tasks provide opportunities for students in all grade bands to practice reading, writing, speaking, and listening with rubrics to provide feedback. Additional Toolkits (2022, 2023) can be purchased through NABE.



There are rubrics and checklists aligned to the ELP Standards that districts can use to assess their students' performance throughout the school year. These are available on

the <u>Nebraska EL Resources Shared Drive</u>. Educators just need to request permission to join. The <u>rubrics and checklists</u> can be found in the formative assessment folder. <u>This spreadsheet</u> organizes the rubrics/checklists by ELP and grade band and provides links to these resources. These rubrics and checklists help provide feedback to students about their skills and language production. They can also serve to guide instruction that will prepare students for the tasks they will be asked to do on the ELPA21 Summative or Alt ELPA Assessment.

As a reminder, districts need to make sure their student information systems have accurate EL information so that all English learners who need to be tested are coded correctly and any students who have already met proficiency are not tested. The NDE upload will be **January 7, 2026. The English Language Testing report in Advisor is a good one to check. <u>ELPA21 Training Modules</u> open December 1, 2025.

Practice Opportunities



Guidance: TITLE I: SECTION 1112(e)(3) AND (e)(4) OF THE ESEA (20 USC 6312)

There are Title I requirements for notifying parents of their children's EL status and their right to opt their children out of EL programs or particular EL services. SEAs and LEAs that receive Title I or Title III funds should be familiar with the requirements of Title I and Title III and ensure parental notification letters include all statutorily required elements. More information can be found in the English Learner Toolkit, Chapter 7, page 4. Rule 15 also provides this guidance in Section 003: Identification of English Learners.
