






## **ELPA21 Summative and Alt ELPA Assessments**

We are getting closer and closer to the ELPA Assessments testing window (January 26-March 13, 2026). As a reminder, districts need to make sure their student information systems have accurate EL information so that all English learners who need to be tested are coded correctly and any students who have already met proficiency are not tested. The NDE upload into TIDE will be **January 7, 2026**. The English Language Testing report in <u>Advisor</u> is a good one to check. If there are any questions, please contact us and we will be happy to help.

There are many tools in the <u>resources</u> of our NE Cambium Portal to help prepare for testing. The <u>Testing Times chart</u> and <u>Number of Test Questions</u> by <u>Domain</u> can guide planning and scheduling of the domains. Last year, Amanda Skalka shared her <u>template</u> that helps with scheduling. This year, Tracy Garvey shared ideas from her district at our <u>December EL Coalition meeting.</u> Check out the <u>One-Stop-Shop</u> for the presentation and recording.





The <u>ELPA21 Training Modules</u> opened December 1, 2025. There are also great training modules for learning more about the ELPA test administration (<u>Summative/Alt</u>), and understanding the reports (<u>Summative/Alt</u>). The <u>ELPA21 Summative Accessibility Manual</u> and <u>Alt ELPA Accessibility manual</u> are very helpful in making best decisions for your students.

## Spotlight: Maggie Sis, NDE Statewide Assessment Program Specialist


Maggie Sis serves as the NDE Statewide Assessment Program Specialist. In this role, she acts as a key liaison between the NDE, public school districts, external programs, and assessment vendors on all matters related to assessment student data. Throughout the year, Maggie oversees the full assessment data lifecycle—from pre-test verification in the fall, to student, test, and report management during testing windows, and finally to post-test verification and student results, including NEP and AQuESTT

**Guidance:** According to Nebraska Rule 15, parents have the right to waive English learner services for their children but they still need to take the annual ELPA21 Summative or Alt ELPA assessments. The only way for a student to exit English learner services is through a proficient score on their ELPA21 assessment. Students need to score 4s and/or 5s on each domain (reading, writing, speaking, and listening).
